Lastly, we hope to work hard upgrading the Discovery Room this fall. Please let me know if you would like to contribute funds for its new look.

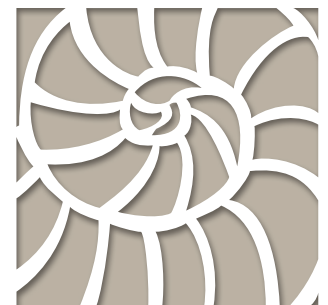

The CADDO: Traditions and Heritage

June 18-August 30, 2009

TOURING

This exhibit carefully considers the Caddo tribe's long and distinguished history, both ancient and living Caddo traditions, and the tribe's many contributions to the cultural heritage of Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas, and Oklahoma. Displays will explain who the Caddo are, who they were, where they came from, and what Caddo life was like at different points in history. Archival and



modern photographs, artwork, documents, and maps will accompany interpretive panels provided by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD). The display will be further enhanced with items representative of Caddo material culture from the Museum's own collections and original art representing Native American tribal culture by Dr. Robert Schiffhauer and Dr. Donald Clark, local artists.

This program made possible in part through Hotel Tax Revenue funded from the City of College Station through the Arts Council of Brazos Valley.



Lone Star Lizards

September 11-November 2, 2009



Developed in cooperation with Texas Cooperative Wildlife Collections, this exhibit will feature live specimens of native Texas herpetofauna, emphasizing the regional lizard population and the Texas horned lizard. Live specimens will be displayed in an array of terrariums each featuring native vegetation simulating natural habitats. Exhibit components will include photographic displays, wet specimens of rare and venomous lizards, examples of the types of scientific equipment associated with laboratory-

based study of amphibians and reptiles. Additional displays will feature artistic and symbolic use of lizards in Native American and other aboriginal cultures alongside of the more technical interpretations offered by scientific illustrations. The exhibit offers visitors the opportunity to see many unusual species, most of which are only briefly spotted in the wild.

From Earth to the Universe

November 11, 2009-January 31, 2010

2009 is the International Year of Astronomy as the world commemorates the 400th anniversary of Galileo Galilei's use of a telescope to study the skies, and Johannes Kepler's publication of *Astronomia Nova*. In acknowledgement of modern astronomy's quadricentennial and in cooperation with TAMU's George Mitchell Institute, the Museum will offer this exceptional exhibition of fantastic images of the Universe captured by ground and space-based telescopes. Popular images of the cosmos can engage the general public not only in the aesthetics of the

visual realm, but also in the science of the knowledge and understanding behind them. The **From Earth to the Universe** project is an exhibition arranged by the IYA2009 that will bring these images to a wider audience in through venues like BVMNH.

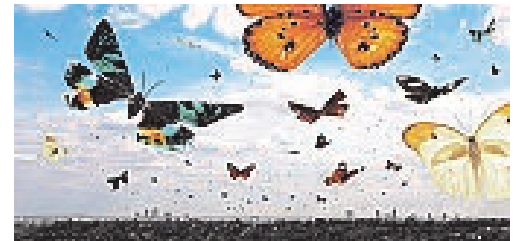
