



Session Information

Each session lasts one week, Monday through Friday, from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Camp sessions are divided into age groups (4-5, 6-7, 8-9, 10-12). Before-camp and after-camp care are available at an additional cost. Before-camp runs from 8:00 am to 9:00 am at \$25/week. After-camp runs from 3:00 pm to 5:15 pm at \$50/week. (Days can be prorated at \$5/day or \$10/day). Campers must arrange before-camp and after-camp care prior to the week needed. An additional \$1 per minute will be charged for pick-up after 5:20 pm.
